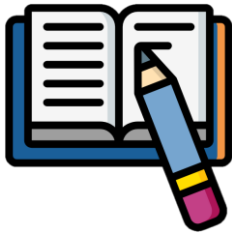


Year 6 – Summer 2

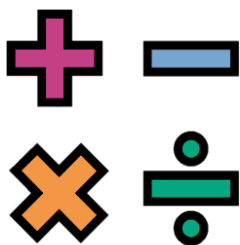
Literacy



In Writing, Year 6 will study *The Unforgotten Coat* by Frank Cottrell Boyce and *Some Places More Than Others* by Renée Watson, exploring themes of belonging, identity and sense of place. Pupils will develop skills in narrative, non-fiction and poetry through writing diaries, dialogue, letters, reports, instructions and poems, with a strong focus on purposeful vocabulary, sentence variety and writing for different audiences.

In Reading lessons, we will study the books *The Wolves of Willoughby Chase* by Joan Aiken and *Incredible Journeys* by Levison Wood, developing whole-book comprehension in fiction and non-fiction. Pupils will explore themes such as survival, courage, injustice and exploration while building key reading skills including inference, retrieval, vocabulary development, summarising and comparison, supported by regular discussion, prediction and evidence-based responses across texts.

Maths



This half-term, Year 6 will complete a series of mathematical projects that revisit key KS2 skills through real-life contexts, strengthening understanding across number, geometry and data handling while making links to design technology, geography and enterprise in preparation for transition to secondary school.

Science



In Science, Year 6 will explore sustainability and the impact humans have on the environment. They will learn about the use of natural resources, renewable and non-renewable energy, waste, recycling and how everyday actions affect ecosystems and climate. Pupils will investigate how sustainable choices can reduce environmental damage and help protect the planet for the future. Throughout the unit, they will develop their scientific enquiry skills through research, data analysis, practical investigations and evidence-based discussion.

Year 6 – Summer 2

Computing



This term, Year 6 will learn how to create a simple webpage, exploring how content is organised, presented and linked online. Pupils will use basic coding skills to structure text, images and links, and will design their webpages for a clear purpose and audience while developing problem-solving and digital literacy skills.

DT



In DT, Year 6 will explore Mexican culture through the lens of cooking and nutrition. They learn about balanced diets, ingredient origins and seasonality, practise essential food preparation and cooking skills, use food labels to make informed choices, and plan, prepare and evaluate a Mexican dish safely and effectively.

History



This term, Year 6 will study the Mayan civilisation as a non-European society and compare it with life in Britain at the same time. They will explore Mayan chronology, daily life, beliefs, achievements and decline, developing skills in comparison, cause and consequence, and evaluating historical significance using evidence..

Languages



This half-term, our Spanish topic will be “Looking Stylish!”. We will be learning the vocabulary for items of clothing. We will be learning to write sentences and learn to translate between English and Spanish.

Year 6 – Summer 2

Music



Year 6 will prepare and rehearse a class awards show by learning songs, creating raps and compositions, and developing confident performance skills. They will refine singing, playing and stagecraft before showcasing their work in a final celebratory performance

PE



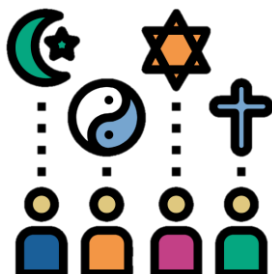
The PE topic this term is Rounders. Year 6 will develop and apply key rounders skills including throwing, catching, batting and fielding, while learning to play with increasing confidence, accuracy and control. They deepen their understanding of rules, tactics and teamwork, make decisions in competitive situations, and evaluate their performance to improve technique, fitness and game play.

PSHE



This term, Year 6 will take part in the Growing and Changing unit, exploring how people change physically and emotionally as they grow. Lessons focus on body image, media influence, managing online pressure, coping with change, and understanding what is normal during puberty. Pupils will also learn about human reproduction in an age-appropriate way and discuss how to keep themselves safe and informed online.

RE



This term, Year 6 will explore key Christian beliefs and moral teachings, including the Trinity, creation and stewardship, salvation, forgiveness and love. They will examine how these beliefs shape Christian ethical choices, lifestyles and social action, developing skills in explanation, evaluation and ethical reasoning.
